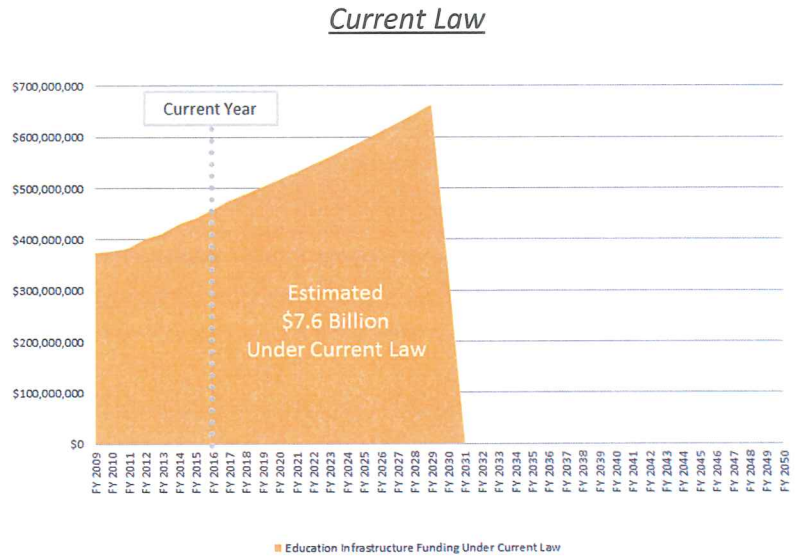


# Support Our Education Infrastructure & Water Quality Efforts

The Secure an Advanced Vision for Education (SAVE) program was enacted on July 1, 2008. These dollars are utilized for school infrastructure needs & school district property tax relief.

According to Iowa law, this funding source expires on December 31, 2029.

The SAVE funding has provided Iowa school districts with more than \$3.2 billion for building projects since 2008.



## Key Provisions of the Legislative Proposal



### Provide Predictability and Long Term Stability to Schools:

By extending the expiration date of funding for education infrastructure through December 31, 2049.



**Increase Education Infrastructure Funding:** Through a \$10 million increase in growth each fiscal year, beginning in fiscal year 2017, and on top of a minimum projected base of **\$458 Million**. This proposal would provide \$100 Million in new dollars each decade for school infrastructure.



**Twenty Year Extension with Growth:** Gives school districts critically needed funding for building projects and property taxpayers confidence their taxes will not be increased to meet education building needs.



### Dedicated Funding Source for Water Quality:

Capture the remaining projected growth to support water quality efforts.



### Support Both Point & Non-Point Water Quality Efforts:

Funding for water quality shall be allocated to non-point water quality efforts at the Iowa Department of Agriculture and to point source water quality through the Iowa Finance Authority and the Iowa Department of Natural Resources.



**Continue Collaboration:** Continue to collaborate with Iowa landowners, cities, counties and others on a science-based approach to water quality and assist un-sewered communities with treatment options.
